hirty-four members of Covenant Presbyterian Church in Charlotte, North Carolina helped members of the Church of Jesus Light of the World in Calcachen, Yucatan, roof their Sunday school rooms as well as expand their patio in July. or years my primary relationship with Acción Ministries was to bring a team of students from our church to build roofs on either houses and/or a church in the summer. This is an amazing experience which our church still continues to this day. These trips have and continue to have a tremendous impact on the lives of the students and leaders who participate. Roger and Oscar have consistently shared that what we do is simply not 'building a roof' for a family or community of faith, but primarily we are taking part in God's mission and kingdom building in that community.

Projects and Operations

Praise God for the continuing success of the Mayan Children's Village (Villa Infantil Maya, "VIM"), Student House Merida Estudiantil Merida, "CEM"), and the mission work teams! Thank you for your support of these programs! Young Mexican men and women are graduating and eager young minds and spirits are coming off the waiting list and into VIM and CEM. Homes, churches and VIM facilities have seen great improvements! Check out the photos on our Facebook page that is updated by Acción staff member. Oveth.

From the financial viewpoint of Friends of Accion, all of the wonderful education and building accomplishments break into two categories: Projects and Operations. Projects are primarily work team projects, although generous donors also fund other improvements for VIM and CEM, and other needs such as disaster relief. Operations include everything else that keep the homes running for the youth and provide staff and vehicles that are essential for Acción. Operations cost more than projects on an annual basis, and have not been funded by any of the project money, even though staff and vehicles

contribute to the projects. All general donations go toward operations; the largest component of which is feeding the students at VIM and CEM.

Beginning this 2014 work team season, we will use a small portion of the work team cost to help fund operations. We are increasing the Acción cost per team member from \$440 to \$500 and plan for this increase to help make operations possible. A review of expenses from the last season's work teams has verified that on average about \$220 per person was spent just on materials and Mexican masons for the work team project. The majority of the remaining \$220 per person went for transportation, with the rest covering everything else related to the project preparation and execution, hammocks housing. Most of the cost increase will be like a tithe to support the ministry of Acción, something that we hope work teams will embrace.

Mission trips, donations for improvements, BECAS sponsorships (see p. 7 for more information), and general donations, all make a real difference in the Yucatan. Please help us keep the operations running, so we can meet the challenge of daily provisions for over 50 youth. Expanded support could allow us to expand the program. Together, we are Christ's hands in the Yucatan, with His love working through us.

# BECAS help Acción support students at VIM and CEM

n early 2013, Friends of Accion created the BECAS program to help fund the cost of students at the Mayan Children's Village (VIM) and Merida Student House (CEM). BECAS, the Spanish word for "scholarships," is an acronym for Building Educational Chances through American Sponsors. It allows the sponsor to fund the cost of an individual student on a full or partial basis. The sponsors can choose an individual student, have one chosen for them or give without designation. During the school year, they will receive information on the students' progress as well as individual letters.

To date, Acción has fifteen full and six partial BECAS scholarships and has generated over \$20,000 to help support our students. This necessary funding will allow us to continue support thirty-three students at VIM and seventeen at CEM. The demand from Mayan families to place their students at VIM and CEM continues to grow. Additional BECAS sponsors will allow Acción to expand the number of students served. Please consider joining us in this effort.
